Report Highlights:

U.S. beef exports under the EU High Quality Beef (HQB) quota increased by over 2,000 metric tons (MT) in 2022, to 13,438 MT. The quota usage rate increased to 52.9 percent, up from 50.1 percent in 2021, despite an increase in the quota from 23,000 MT in 2021 to 25,400 MT in 2022.

THIS REPORT CONTAINS ASSESSMENTS OF COMMODITY AND TRADE ISSUES MADE BY USDA STAFF AND NOT NECESSARILY STATEMENTS OF OFFICIAL U.S. GOVERNMENT POLICY Imports of U.S. beef into the U.S. specific part of the EU High Quality Beef (HQB) quota during 2022 amounted to 13,438.6 MT, or 52.9 percent of the 23,500 MT of quota available for the year. This compares to the 11,532.5 MT exported in 2021, an increase of over 2,000 MT. As the quota availability for the year 2022 was 2,400 MT higher than in 2021, this represents an increase in the quota usage compared to 50.1 percent in 2021.

The increased beef exports under the U.S. specific HQB quota were made possible by the reopening of the EU hospitality sector after restrictions from the COVID-19 crisis were lifted. Nevertheless, looming economic challenges related to high inflation rates and the war in Ukraine might reduce demand for high-priced U.S.-origin beef in 2023.

Background:

The high-quality beef MOU stems from a U.S. WTO win over the EU's restriction on hormones. The <u>Implementing Regulation 2019/2179</u> modifying the HQB quota allocation management was published in the OJ on December 20, 2019 and started on January 1, 2020. Under the new agreement, U.S. specific HQB quota share will increase from 18,500 MT in 2020 to 35,000 MT in 2026 in seven incremental steps as follows:

As the new quota allocation started in the middle of the 2019-2020 quota year and incremental increases have a full-year validity, different quota allotments apply in the first half of the quota year than in the second half. The quarterly quota distribution from 2020 onwards is detailed in the Annex of the above Implementing Regulation 2019/2179.
